- **Dyslexia/Dyscalculia Screening Tests – £80:** These tests involve a range of short activities which, when analysed provide an indication as to whether a student may have a Specific Learning Difficulty such as Dyslexia or Dyscalculia. A report is provided, outlining appropriate intervention and support.
- **Full Diagnostic Assessments – £400:** Carried out by an appropriately qualified specialist, this testing will provide a confirmed diagnosis of a Specific Learning Difficulty, such as Dyslexia, Dyscalculia and Developmental Coordination Disorder etc. A detailed report outlining the results and appropriate recommendations is provided. This testing and report is recognised by universities and can be used for DSA applications.
- **Exam Access Arrangements Testing – from £65:** JCQ regulations state that this testing must only be conducted by appropriately qualified specialists. White Rose Dyslexia Centre employs appropriately qualified and specialists with the necessary experience, qualifications and professional registrations to conduct examination access arrangements. We will detail outcomes within appropriate paperwork and relevant sections of the Form 8.
- **Specialist Workplace Needs Assessment – £250:** Individuals experiencing challenges associated with dyslexia can find it difficult to establish effective coping mechanisms in the workplace. It is then appropriate and often helpful to request a specialist workplace needs assessment to determine a way forward. We have an excellent understanding of dyslexia in the workplace and following a visit and analysis of the individual's job and challenges it presents, we can outline appropriate recommendations as to reasonable adjustments in order to move performance forward.

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Diagnostic Assessments

Diagnostic assessments are carried out within our centre by one of our experienced, highly qualified assessors-either a specialist teacher or a consulting, chartered psychologist.

Usually, but not exclusively, adults are assessed by chartered occupational psychologist, Mrs Justine Webb and children by specialist teacher, Mrs Karen Anderson.

The regulations have recently been changed and, although previously only those obtained after the age of 16 were admissible, now a report obtained at any age can be used as evidence of specific learning difficulties when applying for Disabled Students' Allowance (D.S.A.) in Higher Education.

Before the assessment appointment:

You will receive an email confirming the appointment, with travel directions, applicable questionnaires and payment details.

Please return the completed questionnaire(s) at least one week before the appointment date as they provide important background information and ensure that the assessor is appropriately prepared.

If you wish the school/college to be involved, please pass on the appropriate questionnaire to them to complete.

If the application for GCSE or GCE exam access arrangements are a likely outcome, permission to liaise with the school or college will be required for the completion of the necessary paperwork.

During the assessment appointment:

Please allow up to 3 hours for the appointment. Accompanying friends or family are welcome to use our waiting room where hot and cold drinks are provided.

Ample, free parking is available on site.

The assessor will discuss the information contained in your questionnaires and your current needs and concerns.

The formal process involves assessment of performance in verbal and non-verbal underlying ability, levels of attainment in reading, spelling, writing (and sometimes maths) and diagnostic testing to investigate the presence of dyslexia and possible indications of other specific learning difficulties.

Areas of strength are identified as well as any problem areas.

Some verbal feedback will be provided at the end of the session.

Following the assessment appointment:

The completed report is emailed within 3 working weeks of the assessment date.

This comprehensive report details scores, conclusions reached and personalised recommendations for support. It may suggest, for example, appropriate exam access arrangements, useful resources, assistive technologies and/or access to specialist tuition.

After the report has been received, a ½ hour post-assessment feedback session can be arranged to discuss the findings/recommendations in the report, if required.

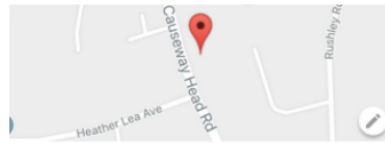

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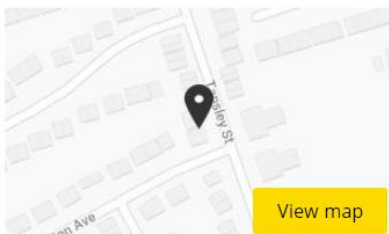
