PE Development Week	The profile of PE was raised hugely this week. A series of lessons were observed and feedback provided. Pupil voice was also taken along with staff questionnaires.	Appropriate CPD was planned and delivered and therefore it is hoped that the quality of PE teaching will continue to improve each year. PE development week will hopefully occur again during the next academic year.
Sports Leaders expansion	The team of Sports Leaders has risen to 21 this year. This has allowed them to work in small groups to fulfill a series of duties and assist with the delivery of clubs and physical activity.	What is really pleasing is the raised aspirations to become a Sports Leaders. Children are already talking about the want to be a leader which places value on the role and this can only help improve PE and school sport as we move forward.
Further development of Girls Football	Through the employment of Girls Activators and additional Sports Leaders, we have managed to provide opportunities for girls to play football every Friday. We have also hosted the first ever Westway Cup. This took place over two nights, one being for girls only.	The number of girls participating in football has risen. In addition to what we are doing on school site, we expanded our involvement in the Sheffield Federation for School Sport Competitions to two teams.
The vast array of sporting competitions	In the last 3 years, Westways have really aspired to attend as many events and competitions as possible, both with the Sheffield Federation, Arches SSP and School Games. This has been particularly true this year with a record breaking number of sporting events attended. ### Meeting National Curriculum requirements for swimming and water safety.

What percentage of your current Year 6 cohort can swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres?	48.75%	This raised from the start point of 12.94%. Additional Top up lessons were offered to children who could not yet reach the 25m. Not all were accessed. Top up lessons were at not cost to the Sports Premium.
What percentage of your current Year 6 cohort can use a range of strokes effectively [for example, front crawl, backstroke, and breaststroke]?	33.75%	Additional Top up lessons were offered to children who could not yet reach the 25m. Not all were accessed. Top up lessons were at not cost to the Sports Premium.
What percentage of your current Year 6 cohort are able to perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations?	96.25%	A huge emphasis was placed on this. This missing 3.5% was mainly down to child absence or lack of engagement in swimming lessons.
If your schools swimming data is below national expectation, you can choose to use the Primary PE and sport premium to provide additional top-up sessions for those pupils that did not meet National Curriculum requirements after the completion of core lessons. Have you done this?	Yes	However, top up lessons were not charged to the Sports Premium. It came out of existing school budgets.
Have you provided CPD to improve the knowledge and confidence of staff to be able to teach swimming and water safety?	No	However, all staff who attend swimming have attended briefings/initial training provided by Sheffield Swimming Services. We had an ECT this year who took children to the pool and found this to be very beneficial.
