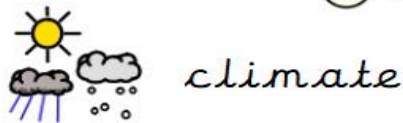
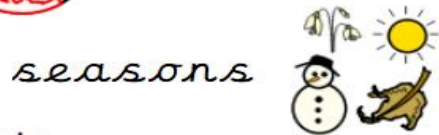


Knowledge Organiser: Do We Look After Our World?



Our Planet

The Earth is split into land and ocean.



Weather on Earth

Places nearer the equator are some of the warmest parts of our planet. Places near the North and South Poles are some of the coldest parts of our planet.

Seasons of a place are linked to how far away from the equator they are.

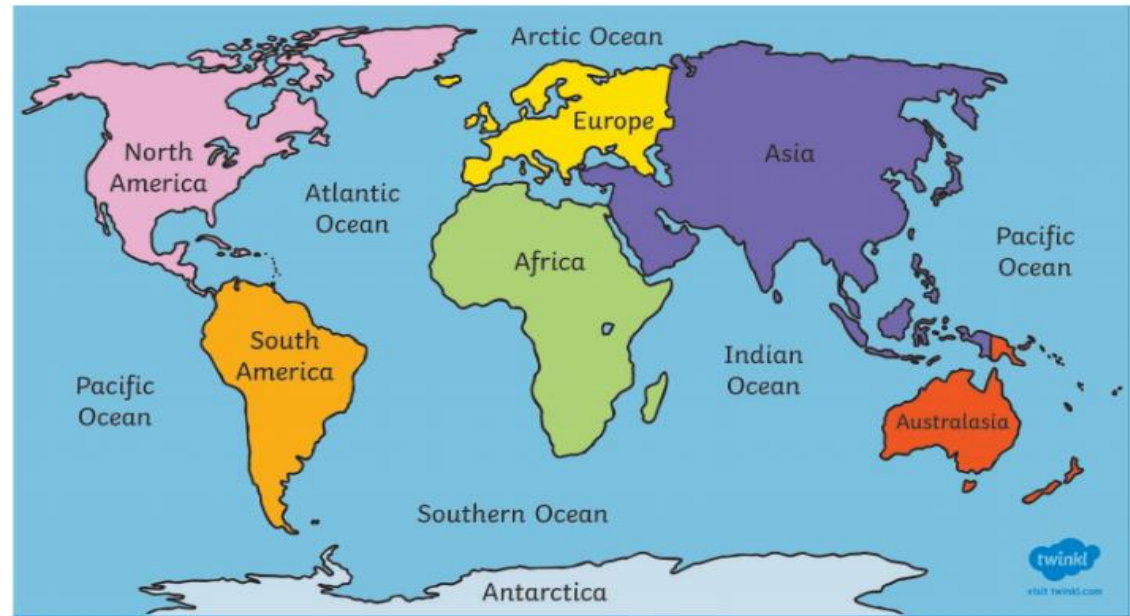
Some places have four seasons (Spring, Summer, Autumn and Winter)



Other places have two seasons (wet and dry) but the temperature stays the same all year round.



There are seven continents and five oceans on our planet.

Life Below Water

We need to look after our oceans and seas so that we don't damage the plants and animals that live there.



Life on Land

We need to look after our world and make sure we use its resources responsibly.

Vocabulary

Continent - A large area of land that contains groups of countries. The world has seven continents.

Ocean - A large area of water, bigger than a sea.

Equator - An imaginary line around the middle of the Earth.

Poles - The top (North Pole) and bottom (South Pole) parts of the Earth and the Earth spins around them.

Season - The UK has four seasons (Spring, Summer, Autumn and Winter) that have different usual weathers and temperatures.

Climate - The usual weather and temperature over a longer period of time. Different areas have different climates.

Weather - The daily change in the state of the atmosphere.
