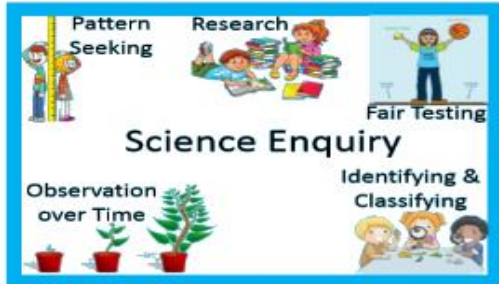

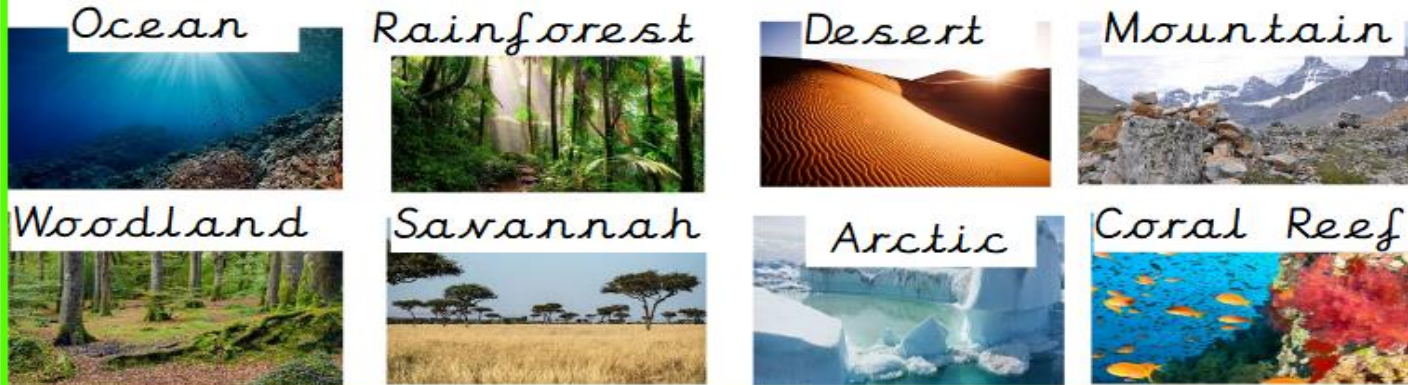


What is a habitat?

'Micro' means very small. A microhabitat is a very small habitat.

Vocabulary

Habitat - The natural environment of an animal or plant.

Microhabitat - A very small habitat. For example a piles of leaves or under a rock.

Reproduce - For animals to have babies or for plants to make seeds to grow a new plant.

Savannah - A flat area of land covered with tall grasses. They may have some bushes and trees. They have a dry season and a wet season.

Rainforest - Found in warm areas, they are places filled with tall trees and leafy plants. It often rains every day.

Desert - Any large region that gets very little rain each year. Very few plants or animals live in desert areas. Not all deserts are sandy.

Coral Reef - Made up of tiny animals (not plants) they grow in warm, tropical areas close the surface of the ocean and are usually found near areas with waves.
